H. Gálvez: The PGSLF breakdown has arrived, departments were made aware of the money they would receive. An update on September expenditures was done. PGSS will be holding referenda on the CKUT fee and on the PGSS member fee. SPF gives out a lot of money and we could use it for our campus initiatives.

J. Ziegler: Report of Faculty Meeting of October 16th, 2015

Chris Buddle gave a presentation on student Wellness

Cameron Butler student wellness director funded by sustainability development fund:

- -They ran the consent McGill program and are running the mental health week.
- In the winter semester will be focusing on resources for staff to direct students. Tanja Beck Asc director of OSD:
- -Really into access for students to resources
- -Provide support services and reasonable accommodation to students with medical documentation.
- -Working on collaborating with faculty and staff.
- -Nearly a tripling in students registered in OSD since 2006
- -Mental health is the largest category.
- -Opportunities for OSD collaborating with faculty- OSD will give presentations tailored to a given need, resources on how to deal with certain issues, and ways of reducing the stigma.
- -Similar trends across universities of increasing students with office of students with disabilities.

Elizabeth Cawley-Fiset - Mental health strategy consultant for McGill:

- -McGill has really been reactionary, they want to focus on skill building
- -McGill students have higher rates of depression and substance abuse to the US national average.
- -McGill doesn't have the resources to give students the help they need.
- -Mental Health Working Group evaluating mental health services.
- -Stepped care model for mental health is what they are going for
- -Start by relying on information, self help, interactional online self-help, coaching on-line/drop in, then group therapy, then individual therapy, psychiatric consultations, etc.
- -Alternative is Embedded Counselor Model which they've submitted funding for:
- -Faculty based wellness managers.

Whereas, the ongoing legal dispute between MCSS and PGSS over the Building Maintenance Fund and Memorandum of Agreement [MoA] is still unresolved.

Whereas, there is much uncertainty on what will happen to MCGSS's sources of revenue when/if an agreement is reached.

Whereas, the legal expenses associated to the case have already gone above \$5,000.00 CAD.

Whereas, the MCGSS executive is unable to plan it's finances properly until this issue is resolved.

Be it resolved, That MCGSS will suspend, until further notice, payments and reimbursements associated with the following line items of its 2015-2016 budget: PGSS Activities, Club Fund Requests, Grad Room Improvements, Other and Activities (Others).

Be it further resolved, That MCGSS will lower the amount budgeted for legal expenses to the original \$5,000.00 CAD originally promised to PGSS.

Be it further resolved, That all MCGSS activities (including Council and Executive meetings) will continue to go forward with the understanding that their budget might be reduced at any future MCGSS council meeting.

Be it further resolved, That the MCGSS Travel Grant program and Peer Helper Program will continue to go ahead as planned, until further notice.

J. Singh asked how it would affect clubs. K. Mittal asked how it will affect clubs that already had expenses. H. Gálvez answered that no promise was made to any club yet this year. K. Mittal asked if clubs who applied get a notice if their demand is rejected. H. Gálvez said that he did it for as long as he has been treasurer.

5. Motion to amend the bylaws

Whereas, the ongoing legal dispute between MCSS and PGSS over the Building Maintenance Fund and MoA is still unresolved.

Whereas, there is much uncertainty on what will happen to MCGSS's sources of revenue when/if an agreement is reached.

Whereas, there is concern on the part of the MCGSS Executive Committee that the portion of the PGSS Membership Fee currently allocated to MCGSS activities will be reduced by the PGSS Executive Committee.

Whereas, a loss of revenue from the PGSS Membership Fee would amount to a financial shortfall that would require the suspension and/or downsizing of the majority of MCGSS activities.

Whereas, in July 2015, a total of \$5,561.53 were collected by MCGSS from unused and unbudgeted PGSLF funds from previous years.

Whereas, MCGSS has been advised by PGSS that it is the only PGSA to currently receive money beyond it's PGSLF funds and that other PGSA's fund their activities exclusively through their PGSLF.

Whereas, currently, there is no way to ask a referendum question to raise PGSS fees only for Macdonald Campus graduate students.

Be it resolved, That the MCGSS By-Laws be ammended as follows:

Be it resolved, That no funds be allocated to clubs for the moment, keeping in mind that the results of the PGSS referenda may affect this decision. Moved by H. Gálvez, seconded by G. Limniatis. Motion carried by unanimous consent.

M. Kaji informed council that MCSS will fund MISA.

Be it resolved, That we build a tutorial on how to opt-out from fees and publicise it in our December newsletter.
